Dear Mr. Harrison:

Doctor Hugo Trucco-Lee, Vice-Rector of the University of Concepcion, has kindly offered to deliver this letter personally to you during his coming visit to New York.

After I wrote you expressing my appreciation for the Rockefeller Foundation grant to the University of Concepcion, I received a letter from Rector David Stitchkin and another from Sergio Vodanovic.

In regard to my plans for this year, their considered opinion is that instead of continuing the activities of the first workshop now it would be ~~better~~ preferable to wait until April when all the University activities start again, after the Summer recess. I believe their suggestion is a good one and I hope the Rockefeller Foundation will have no objection to our proceeding in this manner.

Rector Stitchkin also informs me that the University of Concepcion has approved an expenditure of ten thousand dollars to help finance our second workshop.

As I said in my last letter, we should like to offer ten scholarships for the academic year of 1961, that is to say, from April to December. In accordance with new developments, we ~~w~~ould also extend for five months the sbholarships of the three members of the first workshop who ran out of time before they could finish their work.

I am sure doctor Trucco will explain our plans more accurately and with more detail.
